Escaping Fantasy: Shemot 5770

Portion: Bo - The Tenth Plague

If you were in a position to save someone's life, would you just save them, or would you ask them to do something first? Can you think of any circumstances where you might ask someone who was about to die to take a suggested action before you saved them, even though you could save them just as easily if they did not do as you asked? And if they failed to take your suggestion, to do what you asked, would you fail to save them, and simply allow them to perish? These are complex moral questions, which are highlighted by HaShem's own actions in this week's Torah portion. When G-d informed Moshe that every first born in Egypt would be killed, HaShem simultaneously ordered the Jewish people to wipe blood on their doorposts in order to save their first-borns. Why was this necessary? G-d could certainly have decreed Jewish first-borns wouldn't die in this the tenth and final plague. In this week's class we will be studying the tenth and final plague in depth. We'll be providing a number of perspectives that demonstrate how and why the tenth plague was categorically different from the nine plagues that preceded it, and we'll discover why the command to paint our doorposts in blood was a natural precursor to the end of the Egyptian exile.
